manuia- Weave an environment for a better future'. We started the week coming together as a whole school to sing the Samoan National Anthem and raise the Samoan flag. Thanks you to Joseph Fa'afiu, a Samoan leader and author who shared stories with us, and Ava and Dtanian who led the ceremony. This was followed by morning tea where the whole school tasted panikeke and koko laisa -wonderful Samoan treats. I would like to acknowledge our Social Worker in Schools (SWIS) team and in particular Maria and Anna who have helped us with planning, sharing their expertise and cooking. I would also like to thank the Tusani family and the Barrington-Tulaga family who have helped the school in planning a wonderful week that celebrates Samoan culture.

We will end the week on Friday 31 May with a shared lunch where we can taste some more scrummy Samoan dishes followed by a sharing assembly at 2pm. 'Weave an environment for a better future' also includes thinking about a shared lunch with zero waste, so we ask that children use their lunch boxes to hold the food they choose to eat from the shared lunch. If your family would like to contribute to the Samoan shared lunch please bring food to school ready to share at 1pm Friday. 

Measles in Auckland schools

Please vaccinate your child or young person if they have not had one measles (MMR) vaccine. It is free at your GP.

Students in a class with someone who has measles may be asked to stay home for one to two weeks, if they have had no MMR vaccinations.

Students with one or more MMR vaccinations can still attend school.

Check your child's immunisation records in their Well Child/Tamariki Ora book or ring your GP clinic.

Tell your GP or after hours clinic if you suspect measles before you arrive, so you don't infect others.

Symptoms: cough, runny nose, fever, sore red eyes, then a rash.
