DMIC Maths

Doing maths' is looking a little different these days in some classrooms, as more collaborative approaches to solving mathematics problems are being encouraged.

At Waterlea, our Year 1 to 4 tamariki are working with this collaborative approach this year. Our kaiako have begun professional development and are engaging in ongoing supervision and mentor meetings with Massey University staff, constructing what this approach to mathematics looks like at Waterlea School.

Learning conversations include all students, and everyone feels that their contribution is valued. Students feel that everyone succeeds when the group succeeds.

Toys and Trading at School

We ask that children do not bring toys, novelty stationery/accessories or valuable items to school. Trading of these items is not appropriate at school either and can create conflict. These items are better left at home or, if they must come to school, they need to be handed to the teacher or the office for safekeeping.

We currently have a couple of cases of Chickenpox in Year 1. Chickenpox is a common childhood illness caused by a virus-it is very easy to catch but most cases are usually mild. It first appears as cold symptoms but then a red rash of small blisters will appear on the body, usually starting on the face, chest and back. Children should stay away from school while they are infectious-once scabs form on all the spots, your child is no longer infectious. They may go back to school when the spots are all scabbed over and dry. This can take around 5-7 days. Please refer to your doctor if your child is presenting the above signs and has not yet had chicken pox.
