On Monday a new group of Year 1 students had their first day at school in Room 22 and Room 4. We welcome these new tamariki and their whaanau to Waterlea School and look forward to building a strong partnership for the coming six years. Samia Mahmood is the teacher in Room 22 and she says everyone is settling in well.

Another group of Year 1 tamariki had an exciting day last week. It wasn't their first day but their 100th day at school! To celebrate this anniversary, tamariki in Room 2 (who are residing in Room 21 this term) drew portraits of themselves at 100 years old and wrote stories about what they would like to be doing when they turned 100. They also celebrated with a special 100 cake! Counting the first 100 days of school also provided lots of opportunities to learn foundational maths knowledge such as counting in 1s,2s and 10s to 100 in a fun and authentic way.









The teaching and learning of maths has changed considerably since the adults in the Waterlea community were in primary school. While learning the basics in maths will always be important, it is no longer sufficient just to know your times tables - our tamariki are supported to apply the basics to solve everyday maths problems by collaborating with their peers. Teachers themselves have had to engage in new learning, in order to set up classrooms where tamariki can be successful, collaborative problem solvers. Over the past couple of years, even during lockdowns, our Kaiako engaged in quite intensive professional development involving working alongside mentors from Massey University. We call the approach we use to teach maths, DMIC - Developing Mathematical Inquiry Communities. Next term we are planning a Whaanau Day and will invite you into your child's classroom to see a DMIC lesson in action. New Zealand Curriculum Refresh and Teacher Only Days

The NZ curriculum is going through a refresh process which will impact the teaching and learning in all schools throughout the motu. In order to prepare for the changes coming, schools have been asked to hold two Teacher Only Days this year during the school terms. Waterlea's first Teacher Only Day is straight after the school holidays, on 24 April which is also the day before the ANZAC Day public holiday. On this day we will collaborate with our Kahui Ako partnership schools to do this mahi. The date for the second teacher only day has not been confirmed but as soon as it is we'll let you know. As well as these planned nationwide teacher only days, Waterlea will use team meetings and holiday call back days to make the necessary changes to our existing curriculum.
