Last Friday our Kaiako attended a teacher only day with the other teachers from our Kahui Ako. This was an opportunity for our staff to dive a little deeper into Te Mātaiaho, The New Zealand Curriculum for English. This working document has been in development for the past couple of years and is now at a stage where we are using this as the basis for our planning and understanding of progression.

We had the opportunity to hear from a Ministry of Education curriculum specialist who guided us through making connections between our existing planning and the curriculum document. As we have been on the structured literacy journey over the past couple of years, we are well set up to be working towards the progress outcomes of the curriculum.

As a staff we will continue to deepen our mahi in this space along with Te Mātaiaho, The New Zealand Curriculum for Mathematics and Statistics. More information will come out around mathematics at Waterlea at a later date.

There is likely to be another teacher only day later this year where the Kahui Ako will get together for some further professional development. This is only available to us as a Kahui Ako, rather than as an individual school. This date has not been confirmed, but as soon as it is we'll let you know. As well as these planned nationwide teacher only days, Waterlea will use team meetings and holiday call back days to make the necessary changes to our existing curriculum.

We couldn't go on number ten, we could only go to number six.


I went on number one everything was going good until I
